

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE POLICY PLAIN LANGUAGE SUMMARY



Obtaining Assistance with Your Bill

This information is for anyone who receives hospital services from Orlando Health and our affiliated hospitals. In an effort to meet the community's healthcare needs, financial assistance is available to Patients/Guarantors (person that is financially responsible) who have limited or no resources to pay for emergent or medically necessary services rendered at an Orlando Health facility.

Financial assistance applies to bills from Orlando Health and employed physicians. All Orlando Health employed physicians must follow Orlando Health's Financial Assistance Policy (FAP). Contracted, Community/Private providers are not required to participate in Orlando Health's financial assistance program. The FAP, Plain Language Summary, and Patient Financial Resources brochure are available in English, Spanish, French Creole and Portuguese.

How Do I Qualify for Financial Assistance?

You can ask for help with your bill at any time before, during, or after your hospital stay. Financial assistance is based on information that considers your yearly income and family size. Based on current Federal Poverty Guidelines, you may qualify for free care by reviewing income, assets, and other resources. An FAP eligible Patient/Guarantor may not be charged more than the Amounts Generally Billed (AGB) for emergency or other medically necessary care.

Paperwork

You are responsible for providing timely information about your health benefits, income, assets, and any other paperwork that will help to see if you qualify. Paperwork might be bank statements, income tax forms, check stubs, or other documents.

Collection Activities

You are responsible for any bills until your application has been reviewed and approved for financial assistance. Bills that are not paid 240 days after the first billing date may be reported on the Patients/Guarantor credit history.
