

PGY-1 Pharmacy Practice Residents

Min Choi, Pharm.D.



Dr. Min Choi, from Tampa, FL, received her Doctor of Pharmacy degree from the University of South Florida in 2019. As a PGY-1 pharmacy resident at Orlando Health, Dr. Choi will participate in patient-care rounds and monthly code coverage. She will complete a research project evaluating the incidence of opioid associated iatrogenic withdrawal in medical ICU patients. In addition, she will conduct an MUE assessing proper monitoring for patients on DOACs prior to initiation of heparin infusion. She will also present a seminar on management of patients with reported beta-lactam allergies. Following completion of her residency, Dr. Choi plans to pursue a PGY-2 pharmacy residency in emergency medicine or critical care.

Dr. Rachel Hatton, from Sugar Land, TX, received her Doctor of Pharmacy degree from Nova Southeastern University in 2019. Following the completion of her residency, Dr. Hatton plans to pursue a PGY-2 pharmacy residency and a career in clinical pharmacy with a focus in hematology/oncology.

She will conduct a research project on the use of piperacillin/tazobactam versus cefazolin plus gentamicin for open fractures, a medication use evaluation on surgical prophylaxis in patients with a penicillin allergy, and a continuing education seminar on hyperthermia management. Following the completion of her residency, Dr. Molineros plans to pursue a PGY-2 pharmacy residency and a career in clinical pharmacy with a focus in critical care or emergency medicine.

Megan Ciborowski, Pharm.D.


