Importance of Recapturing Chronic Conditions

What is the Importance of the Risk Adjustment Process?

- This process is used to estimate future health spending by utilizing ICD-10 codes that roll
 up to certain Hierarchal Condition Categories (HCCs). Conditions in these categories
 have an impact on the Risk Adjustment Factor (RAF) score and should be assessed
 and coded, when appropriate, once every calendar year
- To accurately estimate risk scores, it often requires a coordinated effort across physicians, coding professionals and/or management teams

Steps to Recapturing Chronic Conditions:

D. S. P. – **D**iagnosis, **S**tatus & **S**upport, **P**lan of Treatment

- Schedule patients for a face-to-face encounter or telehealth visit with video, <u>at least</u> once per calendar year.
- Utilize HCC Recapture Best Practice Advisory (BPA) reminders and Risk Coder suggestions for open coding opportunities and suspect conditions (See Page 2).
- Document each chronic condition to the highest level of specificity.
- Document and support all chronic conditions that have been confirmed from consults, radiology and lab results, and specialist notes at least once per year.
- Document and support "status conditions" <u>at least once</u> per calendar year, such as, dialysis status, amputations status, and transplants.
- Review and update the medication and problem list.




Any lapses or inconsistencies in capturing these recurring HCCs can result in an understated risk score. Consistent documentation is the key.


